Research Note Roundtable

The submission of a research note provides practice in communicating research concisely and academically. Skills required when writing your abstract. Requiring only 500 words it does not require extensive presentation preparation time. You submit the note and during the workshop you will be allocated to a small group where you are able to discuss, gain feedback and learn from a leading academic and your peers. In the words of Jacki Johnson, the 2024 Doctoral Workshop Representative

"I speak from first-hand experience on the benefit of participating in the Research Note Roundtable. Last year I submitted a research note for ANZAM 2023 Doctoral workshop and was fortunate enough to be in a small group of four colleagues from across different business schools with Associate Professor Flavio Macau from Edith Cowan University. I can vouch for it being a safe, constructive environment.

This year, I found myself reflecting on what I learned as I wrote up my thesis findings and discussion chapters. A simple question asked in this session whether I really believed all firms can create value for all stakeholders sharpened my focus on how I explained my findings in response to "How Do Australian Listed Firms Contribute Value for all Stakeholders?". The research note discussion contributed to me questioning my data on what differentiates the cultural, strategy and governance practices of the ASX200 and strengthened my theoretical and conceptual model.

The value of the session has been reinforced to me when talking with other colleagues who have participated in the research note session over the years, including successful academics."
